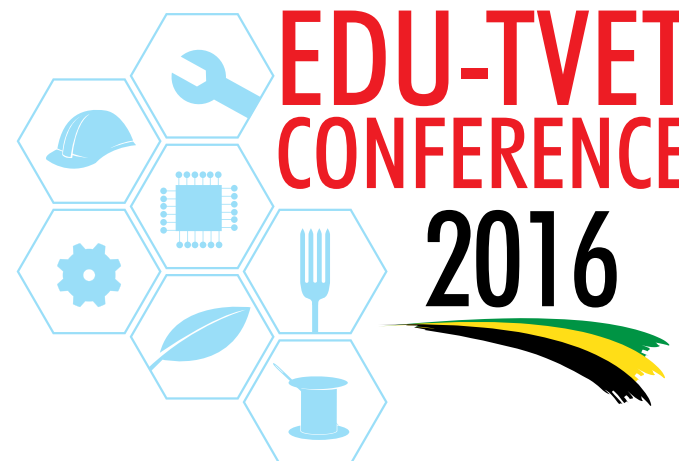

The Joint Committee for Tertiary Education (JCTE) was launched in 1991 under Section 6 of the Education Act. The Joint Committee for Tertiary Education is administered by an Executive body elected by the members. The members of the JCTE are tertiary institutions which are registered with the University Council of Jamaica.

Mission

The mission of the Joint Committee for Tertiary Education is the promotion of tertiary education and training in Jamaica, the strengthening of tertiary institutions and training units both public and private, the pooling of resources and sharing of experiences to promote a common education management culture.

Objectives

In executing its functions, the JCTE seeks to:

- Provide a mechanism for member institutions to address common issues related to tertiary education and training in Jamaica
- Promote more effective communication, collaboration and co-operation between member institutions
- Promote the systematic and integrated planning of tertiary education and training within the context of the national development plans
- Make recommendations to the Minister of Education, Youth and Culture on policies affecting member institutions
- Promote and facilitate proper articulation of programmes within tertiary system
- Strengthen the educational capacity to meet its own high level training, research, consultancy and out-reach needs
- Promote and foster the most recent innovations in technology in the delivery of education and training

Mission and Purpose

The mission of the University Council of Jamaica is to increase the availability of University level training in Jamaica, through accreditation of institutions, courses and programmes for recognition and acceptability. The Council is empowered to grant and confer degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic awards and distinctions on those who have pursued courses

approved by the Council at associated tertiary institution. The University Council of Jamaica functions essentially as an accreditation and awards body for degree and other programmes proposed and implemented at associated tertiary institutions.

Functions

The Council functions essentially as an accrediting, awards and academic development body for degree, diploma and certificate programmes proposed and developed at approved tertiary institutions. Its main functions are:

1. To register all institutions offering tertiary education to ensure that certain minimum standards are met with respect to :
 - Adequacy and suitability of facilities with regard to enrolment
 - Scope, appropriateness and educational value of institutional courses and experiences
 - Qualifications and competence of staff
 - Other operational factors
2. To provide accreditation for degree and specialized programmes by:-
 - Establishing and applying criteria for the accreditation of tertiary higher educational programmes and courses of study
 - Assisting 'associated institutions' in the improvement of their educational programmes
 - Encouraging and facilitating programmes related to national needs.
3. To assist in the development of tertiary Institutions by providing professional advice and services for the development and improvement of programmes
4. To award degrees, diplomas and certificates to students who have pursued such courses at tertiary institutions in Jamaica approved by the Council
