3. LAUNCH OF THE REVISED TERTIARY QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK (TQF)

ome and hear highlights of the revised contents of the TQF which is mapped against international benchmarks of good practice to facilitate ease of recognition and portability of Jamaican tertiary qualifications. Significant change in the higher education sector locally and globally since 2003 has warranted an updated edition of this Framework.

The revised version of the TQF examines the interface between academic and TVET qualifications frameworks. It is also aligned to the National Qualifications Framework of Jamaica (NQF-J).

The TQF is designed to support the work of key stakeholders – chiefly, institutional administrators, educators, curriculum development specialists and UCJ assessors.
